Birds seen at Peuma Hue from end of October through beginning of November

“These birds were seen on Peuma Hue grounds. When I arrived, it was snowing and lots of birds were right on the ground and easy to see. For a couple of days we had very strong winds coming from the West; then the winds died down and it was getting pretty hot. By the time I left it was quite warm and more species were passing through every day. Not everything was seen every day.

Peuma Hue is within easy distance from the Patagonian Steppes and other habitats. I saw several more species in those areas.” As Clara stated.
